

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
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The LIVING CENTER and....



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Inclusivity Assessment

- Have we educated residents and team members about ageism and ableism?
- How do we refer to different levels of living and people who need supportive services? (through the double doors, third floor, down the hill, dementia resident, independent living, etc)
- Do we have policies and practices that unwittingly encourage segregation and ostracism?
- Does our use of common area spaces encourage or discourage inclusivity?
- Is there a noticeable difference in décor/maintenance of different levels of living?
- Are there norms of inclusion in place?
- What messages are we sending through our marketing & advertising?
 - Are we focusing on "super agers"?
- Do we educate about inclusivity during tours?

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Learning Circle Questions

- What kind of community do we want to be? How do we want the people to live here to feel?
- Do you address ageist/ableist messages and conversations when you encounter them? Why or why not?
- Have you ever been treated differently because of your age or different abilities (dementia, assistive devices, etc)? What happened and how did it make you feel?
- Have you ever been discriminated against, ostracized or "left out" of a group? What happened and how did it make you feel?
- In your past, have you worked with others to include and honor others living with different abilities?
- Ageism & ableism are impacting me and others in my community in this way...
